

ROCK CLIMBING, Within the Reserve there are three rock climbing and rappelling areas; Snow Canyon State Park, Paradise Canyon and Pioneer Park. Climbing and rappelling outside designated areas is prohibited. For additional information contact the park at (435) 628-2255 or the Reserve administrator at (435) 634-5759.

HUNTING. The discharge of firearms is prohibited in the Reserve except by licensed hunters during prescribed seasons in accordance with state and local laws. Hunting is permitted within the Reserve in accordance with state and local laws, but it is restricted in City limits and in Snow Canyon State

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GEOCACHING. All geocaches proposed to be located within the boundaries of the Red Cliffs Desert Reserve must have written approval from the Washington County HCP Administration and the appropriate land agency prior to placement.

COMMERCIAL & COMPETITIVE USE Commercial and competitive events require application and prior approval by Reserve and appropriate land agency

PETS. All pets must be on a leash to prevent wildlife disturbance, protect the pets from predators and to avoid conflicts with other people. Hunting dogs are allowed to travel off-leash with a licensed hunter in the act of hunting during the official hunting seasons.

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LEEDS

ACCESSIBILITY. Although the Reserve's backcountry is rough natural terrain, some areas of the Reserve are wheelchair accessible, such as portions of Pioneer Park and Snow Canyon State Park. Paved municipal trails within the Reserve also offer an opportunity to enjoy the scenic beauty of the area. Backcountry trails are protected from motorized access with a sixteen-inch tall "step-over" gate. Horses, hikers and cyclists must use these gates to enter the Reserve.

PARKING. To minimize impacts to the Reserve, parking is allowed in designated areas only. Overnight parking for backcountry camping, hunting, or shuttling is permitted. No camping is permitted in parking

SNOW CANYON STATE PARK. Snow Canyon State Park is located almost entirely within the boundaries of the Reserve, and generally Reserve management prescriptions apply to activities inside the park. Within the park, bicycles must stay on paved trails or roads. Other recreational uses are restricted to designated trails, slickrock areas, and designated rock climbing areas. Some park designated trails may not appear or the Reserve map. Additional Utah State Parks and Recreation regulations apply, including entrance fees. WILDERNESS AREAS. The Red Mountain and Cottonwood Wilderness Areas lie within the Reserve; additional managemer restrictions are enforced within these areas. The most noticeabl restrictions include the closure of these areas to mountain bikes and motorized access.
